## Progress on site

Construction activity on site has progressed rapidly over the last 12 months.

The site has been cleared and major upgrades to underground sewer and stormwater infrastructure are nearly complete.


Piling and excavation activity has also been underway and soon two tower cranes will be established that will support construction of the new Acute Services Building.

The cranes will be in use until 2021 and the Acute Services Building will open to patients in 2022.

The health and safety of patients, families, visitors, staff, workers and the community is our top priority.

The Randwick Campus Redevelopment complies with strict environmental and planning controls and measures are in place to monitor and manage noise, dust and vibration throughout construction.

We are working closely with Transport for NSW, CBD and South East Light Rail, UNSW and Randwick City Council to coordinate construction in the Precinct and minimise any impacts on the community.


## Construction provides opportunities for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander workers and businesses

The Redevelopment Team is working closely with local groups and the La Perouse Local Aboriginal Land Council to identify opportunities for indigenous workers and businesses through the construction of the Acute Services Building.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander workers are already working and receiving training on the construction site. Indigenous businesses are also supplying mobile cranes, rigging services, site security, labour hire, cleaning services, first aid equipment, waste management, office supplies, artwork and fire protection.

A number of initiatives are underway and more opportunities will arise as construction progresses.

### Uncovered: Aboriginal Fire Hearth

Archaeologists have uncovered an Aboriginal fire hearth in the north-west corner of the Redevelopment site. Consulting Heritage Archaeologist Mary Dallas said “the team is hopeful the stones can assist with dating the age of the Aboriginal occupation of this part of the (Botany) dune”.

In consultation with the La Perouse Local Aboriginal Land Council and the Office of Environment and Heritage, the artefacts were successfully removed for analysis and will be securely stored on site until a permanent home is determined.
