

UNSW to invest in Health Translation Hub on Randwick Hospitals Campus

Late last year the NSW Government announced an historic agreement that will see UNSW Sydney invest up to \$250m in a new Health Translation Hub on the corner of Botany Street and High Street.

Bringing together clinicians, researchers, educators and public health, the hub will drive excellence and the rapid translation of

research, innovation and education into patient care at Randwick.

By embedding research into the clinical environment and strengthening links with clinicians and researchers, patients receive better treatment outcomes.

Research also enhances the education experience for the next generation of healthcare professionals.

The Health Translation Hub will open in 2025 and is part of a broader \$500 million commitment to the precinct by UNSW over the next decade.

This investment complements the NSW Government's \$720 million investment to deliver a new Acute Services Building and strengthen the Randwick Health and Education Precinct.

Substantial progress on site

Work to prepare the site for the Randwick Campus Redevelopment and construction of the Acute Services Building is well underway.

Site establishment activities commenced in October and the majority of demolition activity is expected to be complete this month.

Construction hoarding surrounds the site along Botany Street, Magill Street, Hospital Road and High Street.

Current and upcoming construction activities include:

- Piling
- Excavation and removal of top soil
- Sewer and stormwater diversion works.

Strict environmental and planning controls are in place to manage and monitor any impacts such as noise, dust and vibration.

We are working closely with Transport for NSW, CBD and South East Light Rail, and UNSW to coordinate construction projects in the area.

About the Acute Services Building

Opening in 2022, the Prince of Wales Hospital Acute Services Building will deliver a new adult emergency department, extra beds, intensive care unit, and additional operating theatres for the campus.

More than just a new hospital building, this major redevelopment will transform how we deliver health services at Randwick, continuing to attract the best clinicians and meet the changing health needs of our community into the future.
