Community Notice - October 2019


Preparation for construction of the main Acute Services Building structure for the Randwick Campus Redevelopment will continue throughout October.

The health and safety of patients, families, visitors, staff and the community is our top priority.

The Randwick Campus Redevelopment complies with strict environmental and planning controls and measures are in place to monitor and manage noise, dust and vibration.

We are working closely with Transport for NSW, CBD and South East Light Rail, UNSW and Randwick City Council to coordinate construction in the Randwick Precinct and minimise the impact on the area.

Activities may be rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances or inclement weather.



Construction activities continuing during October 2019

- · Piling and bulk excavation
- Trenching and rock excavation
- Installation of sewer and stormwater infrastructure
- Temporary Botany Street and High Street pedestrian diversions
- Undergrounding of overhead power and telecommunications services on Botany Street
- Hoarding modifications and pedestrian diversions
- Work activities on or near the site boundary.

New and upcoming activities

- Temporary changes to parking on the northern kerb of Magill Street will continue to be in place to support the relocation of
 important underground services. Approximately 5 parking spaces may intermittently be occupied through to Mid-October. .
 No service outages are planned during this work.
- Temporary, single lane closures, along Hospital Road are required to safely undertake trenching work and services upgrades. Trenching work requires saw-cutting of Hospital Road and trenching using small excavators and saw-cutters. The hospital car park and loading dock will remain operational and accessible at all times. Road users will be diverted with the support of traffic controllers. Emergency access will be strictly maintained at all times.
- Trenching across Magill Street, at the Botany Street intersection, will require temporary lane closures. Traffic control will be
 on-site to assist during work hours and resident access will be maintained at all times. This activity will occur during the day
 and is expected to take approximately 2-3 days during the month.

Construction site hours

- Monday to Friday, 7:00am to 6:00pm
- Saturday, 8:00am to 5:00pm

Truck movements are being minimised during peak traffic times to reduce impacts on local roads and the community.
