### Research improves patient outcomes

- Acceleration of testing of new ways to prevent and treat diseases
- The design and evaluation of models of care through clinical research and clinical trials
- The co-location of Australia's first Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre within the UNSW HTH and wider Precinct, enabling accelerated care and treatment outcomes.

#### The UNSW HTH includes

- Purpose-built spaces for researchers, educators, students and industry partners to work next to clinicians
- Education, training and research rooms, supporting research and knowledge exchange
- Health initiatives and clinics that directly support patient care
- Food and beverage retail and supporting amenities like allied health services
- Opportunities to showcase community and cultural events.

The UNSW HTH also facilitates direct pedestrian links between UNSW Kensington Campus and the wider Randwick Hospitals Campus.

### Our commitment to open space

- 2,500m² of publicly accessible green space, that is about the size of two Olympic swimming pools
- A healthy, safe, inclusive place that is welcoming for our whole community to learn, work and socialise
- · Zones for play, gathering and reflection
- Pedestrian prioritised pathways to easily connect the new and existing buildings of the Precinct and the broader UNSW Kensington Campus.

### Step inside the UNSW HTH





The main entrance on High Street will be generous with multiple entry points, welcoming the community to the UNSW HTH and wider Randwick Health & Innovation Precinct.



Step inside and walk into a light-filled, generous atrium, the heart of our building. The atrium will be a flexible space that's designed to be highly active, collaborative and connected.



Integrated, equitable and accessible entry to the UNSW HTH, Plaza and easy links through to the Sydney Children's Hospital Stage 1 and the Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre and Randwick Hospitals Campus.



The atrium supports multiple uses including seminar, exhibition, learning and retail to spark creative thinking and knowledge exchange.

#### The Randwick Health & Innovation Precinct

The Randwick Health & Innovation Precinct is an initiative where UNSW's educators, researchers and students can thrive. Students will work side-by-side with researchers on real-life cases and practitioners will be better positioned to answer big research questions and solve significant health problems.

The inspiration is that this shared interaction will allow researchers to undertake studies that are immediately relevant in the real world, with the results of these studies benefitting patients available to the treating clinicians without delay.

The Precinct will move toward a more personalised, holistic approach to healthcare supported by community based services that promote patient participation, early detection of illness and maintenance of good health to prevent illness.

#### Where are we now?

The UNSW HTH will be assessed and determined through the State Significant Development pathway.

A State Significant Development
Application has been lodged with
the NSW Department of Planning,
Industry and Environment (DPIE).
The Environmental Impact
Statement is now on Public
Exhibition and outlines the proposal
and assesses the independent
expert documentation.

The community has an opportunity to review the State Significant Development Application during the public exhibition period.

The UNSW HTH is currently at the planning stage and further detailed design is required prior to construction.

Formal submissions about the proposal may be made on this website during the Public Exhibition period starting from mid-May to mid-June 2021.
