



The Randwick Hospitals Campus has conducted the second annual Travel Census to inform Go Randwick, the Randwick Hospitals Campus Green Travel Plan. Dressed in purple, the Travel Census Team joined the entrance screening teams to encourage participation of the 2020 survey.

The data gained from each Travel Census will identify existing travel behaviours of the campus and inform how Go Randwick sets out future travel demand strategies and initiatives to achieve a targeted reduction in single car driver to the campus. This year will also showcase the impacts COVID-19 has had on the travel patterns of the staff at the Randwick Hospitals Campus.

Upskilling the construction workforce to deliver best practice infection control and prevention

Infection control training has been delivered through the Randwick Campus Redevelopment TAFE Skills Exchange. This course has provided key personnel with the skills to follow infection prevention and control policies and procedures, including implementing standard and transmission-based precautions and responding to infection risks in your workplace.

Delivered by health professionals with expertise in medical infection control this training has been provided as part of NSW Government support for pandemic responsiveness.

First Consumer and Community Advisory Committee for Sydney Children's Hospital Stage 1 and Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre

In September, the first Sydney Children's Hospital Stage 1 and Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre Consumer and Community Advisory Committee took place over Zoom. With 14 representatives on-boarded for the project, the group heard about planning to date from the project team, had a chance to meet each other, and shared why they were interested in being involved.

The newly-formed group represents a diverse mix of individuals representing regional communities, students, local residents and families who have accessed the hospital with their children. The Committee will provide leadership, connection and support to strengthen consumer and community involvement in planning and delivery of the project.

Main structure of the Integrated Acute Services Building underway

Construction of the Prince of Wales Hospital Integrated Acute Services Building main building structure is well underway with the installation of formwork, reinforcements and concrete work. As structure progresses, installation of the building's exterior panelling and glass will commence in October to enclose each level. The Integrated Acute Services Building will reach its full height in early 2021.

iTradies – Supporting Indigenous participation in the workforce

Lendlease and the Aboriginal Employment Strategy recently hosted an Industry Leaders event to support participants of the iTradies program as they embark on their journey to employment.

iTradies is a job readiness program providing training, mentoring, employment and career opportunities for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people on Lendlease project sites. The success of the iTradies program is based on early engagement with employers and securing job opportunities from the program outset.

Lendlease leaders and representatives from our supply chain participated in a traditional Yarning Circle at the event, which is an Indigenous practice of speaking and listening from the heart. Personal stories of growth and career advice were shared with the young candidates who are preparing to enter the workforce.

iTradies participants undergo an intensive two-week program that provides formal training and focusses on life challenges and barriers for new entrants into the construction workforce, rather than solely focusing on the technical work requirements.

Program graduates will commence work at the Randwick Campus Redevelopment this month and will receive ongoing mentoring and support from Aboriginal Employment Strategy as they transition into work.
