Fact Sheet: Salvageable Items

Randwick Campus Redevelopment - Salvageable Items

What are salvageable items?

Salvageable items are found within a property that have been identified as having salvage value. Salvageable items include objects like lead light windows, doors, fixtures and fittings.

Once identified, these items are carefully removed and made available for purchase through a specialist salvage contractor. Along with helping to preserve the historical significance of the era in which the properties were built, salvation also acts as a sustainability measure through the recycling and repurposing of conserved items.

What happens to salvaged items from the Randwick Campus Redevelopment?

Items with salvage value have been identified through internal and external inspections of acquired properties in Magill Street, Botany Street and Eurimbla Avenue.

These items are documented within a catalogue and taken offsite to a storage facility where items are made available for purchase.

Have previous owners been given an opportunity to keep salvageable items?

Yes. During the negotiation process, owners have had the opportunity to identify certain items they wish to be excluded from the sale. Previous owners will also have the opportunity to bid on items through the salvable process.

How do I express interest in purchasing salvaged items?
