

This community notice details construction activities scheduled to occur in July 2020 for the Randwick Campus Redevelopment.

All construction activities are carried out with the health and safety of the local community as our top priority.

We endeavour to keep noise, dust and vibration to a minimum. Where possible, activities are scheduled during approved site hours:

- **Monday to Friday 6am - 10pm**
- **Saturday 7am - 5pm**

Specific works may be conducted outside of these construction hours to ensure the safety of workers, pedestrians and motorists, and to minimise impacts to traffic and hospital access, and will be notified accordingly.

Works are dependent on weather and site conditions and are subject to change.

Ongoing activities

- General construction activities within and near the site boundary
- Tower crane operation within site boundary and supporting construction activity in Hospital Road
- Hoarding modifications and pedestrian diversions as required to facilitate work within the road or footpath
- Concrete finishing
- Deliveries to and from site (including oversized and out of hours deliveries)
- Infrastructure works on Hospital Road, Delivery Drive and Francis Martin Drive
- No through access on Hospital Road for any vehicles, pedestrians and bicycles

New construction activities

Activity	Summary
Temporary closure of the B2 car park entry from Hospital Road	As part of Hospital Road lowering construction works, the B2 car park entry accessed via Hospital Road will be temporarily closed until mid-August 2020. During this time construction activity will include; trenching and excavation, lifting of materials and equipment, preparation of a piling mat using vibratory rollers, piling activity and restorative works. Access to the car park will be primarily through the main entry at Easy Street, accessed via from Barker Street and the B3 entry further south along Hospital Road.
Construction access – Gate 3 Hospital Road near Magill Street	Gate 3, located on Hospital Road near Magill Street, will be activated to support construction vehicle access to the southern portion of the project site. Gate 3 will be used during approved site hours with truck minimisation periods in place to maintain traffic flow into the car park underneath the Royal Hospital for Women. During this time traffic controllers will be stationed at Gate 3 to support vehicle movements in and out of this access point.
Hospital Road services investigations	Service investigations along Hospital Road, between High and Barker Streets, are required to identify underground service locations and inform planned upgrades. Activities include saw cutting in the pavement, excavation and restoration. A coring rig, vacuum truck and equipment will be located in the work area. There will be single lane closures with traffic control in place and safety exclusion zones will be established to ensure worker, pedestrian and vehicle safety.

Activity	Summary
Bulk medical oxygen supply plant – Francis Martin Drive	<p>New infrastructure to support bulk medical oxygen supply for the Randwick Campus Redevelopment will be constructed along Francis Martin Drive, adjacent to the Hospital Car Park. During July, site establishment and preparation works will be carried out including removal of vegetation, saw cutting of road pavement, excavation, installation of support structures inside the car park, restricting access to some car spaces in the car park.</p> <p>For traffic and safety reasons a single lane closure will be in place along Francis Martin Drive during this time. One lane of traffic and emergency access will be maintained at all times under the support of traffic control. This activity will take approximately 15 weeks to complete.</p>
Piling and bulk excavation Hospital Road	<p>Piling and bulk excavation activities will commence during July as part of works required to lower Hospital Road. This work will be carried out along Hospital Road and Delivery Drive. Piles are constructed by drilling into the ground and filling the hole with steel reinforcement and concrete. An alternative piling method will be used that generates less noise and vibration than other common methods. Bulk excavation involves the removal of sand and rock using excavators, rock saws and hammers. Trucks and trailers will be used to remove material from the site compound. Piling and bulk excavation will be undertaken inside the Hospital Road construction site with mitigation measures in place to manage noise, dust and vibration. Respite periods will apply during rock-breaking activities.</p>
Temporary weekend closures of Delivery Drive	<p>To continue service relocations, bulk excavation and piling activity along Hospital Road and Delivery Drive, there will be temporary closures of Delivery Drive and Hospital Loading docks.</p> <p>These scheduled closures will occur over a series of weekends between July and November 2020. Alternative arrangements are in place to ensure essential deliveries and collections are facilitated and will be communicated prior to closure.</p>
