

Construction activities continue on-site for the Prince of Wales Hospital Integrated Acute Services Building; the first stage of the Randwick Campus Redevelopment and the catalyst project for expanding the world-class health, research and education facilities at the Randwick precinct.

August construction activities

Concrete pours will continue as each level of the Integrated Acute Services Building begins to take shape. To facilitate the construction of the building structure, crane operation, light and heavy vehicle use, machinery and equipment use, and temporary hoarding changes will continue.

The temporary closure of the Hospital car park access at level B2 will also continue this month. To inform ongoing planning for future construction activities, service investigations will occur on the northern and southern portions of Hospital Road.

As part of our focus on future proofing the new facilities, a new fire booster will be installed on Hospital Road between car park entries B2 and B3 and a new bulk oxygen storage facility will also be installed on Francis Martin Drive over the coming months.



Piling and bulk excavation, which commenced on Delivery Drive in late July, will continue over extended weekend hours (refer over leaf for further details). Due to the complex nature of the site, and to minimise disruption on health services and the local traffic network during peak periods, construction works over extended weekend hours will continue to be required during the next 18 months. We are committed to ensuring our neighbours continue to receive updates in advance of any planned weekend works.

Construction hours

Where possible, activities are scheduled during approved site hours:

- Monday to Friday 6am - 10pm
- Saturday 7am - 5pm

Specific works, such as piling and bulk excavation, will be conducted outside of the approved hours to minimise disruption to health services and to minimise impacts on traffic and hospital access. Scheduling of work continues to be dependent on weather and site conditions and may be subject to change.

Minimising construction impacts

We are committed to minimising the impact of our works where we can. All construction activities are carried out with the health and safety of the local community as our top priority. We endeavour to keep noise, dust and vibration to a minimum.

Some ways we do this include:

- truck minimisation periods during peak times to maintain traffic flow into the car parks from Hospital Road
- traffic control and safety exclusion zones established to ensure worker, pedestrian and vehicle safety
- mitigation measures in place to manage light spill, dust, noise and vibration
- noise, dust and vibration monitoring devices in use 24 hours per day, 7 days per week
- conducting high impact works during standard hours with respite periods during rock-breaking activities
- coordinating works to ensure hospital operations continuity.

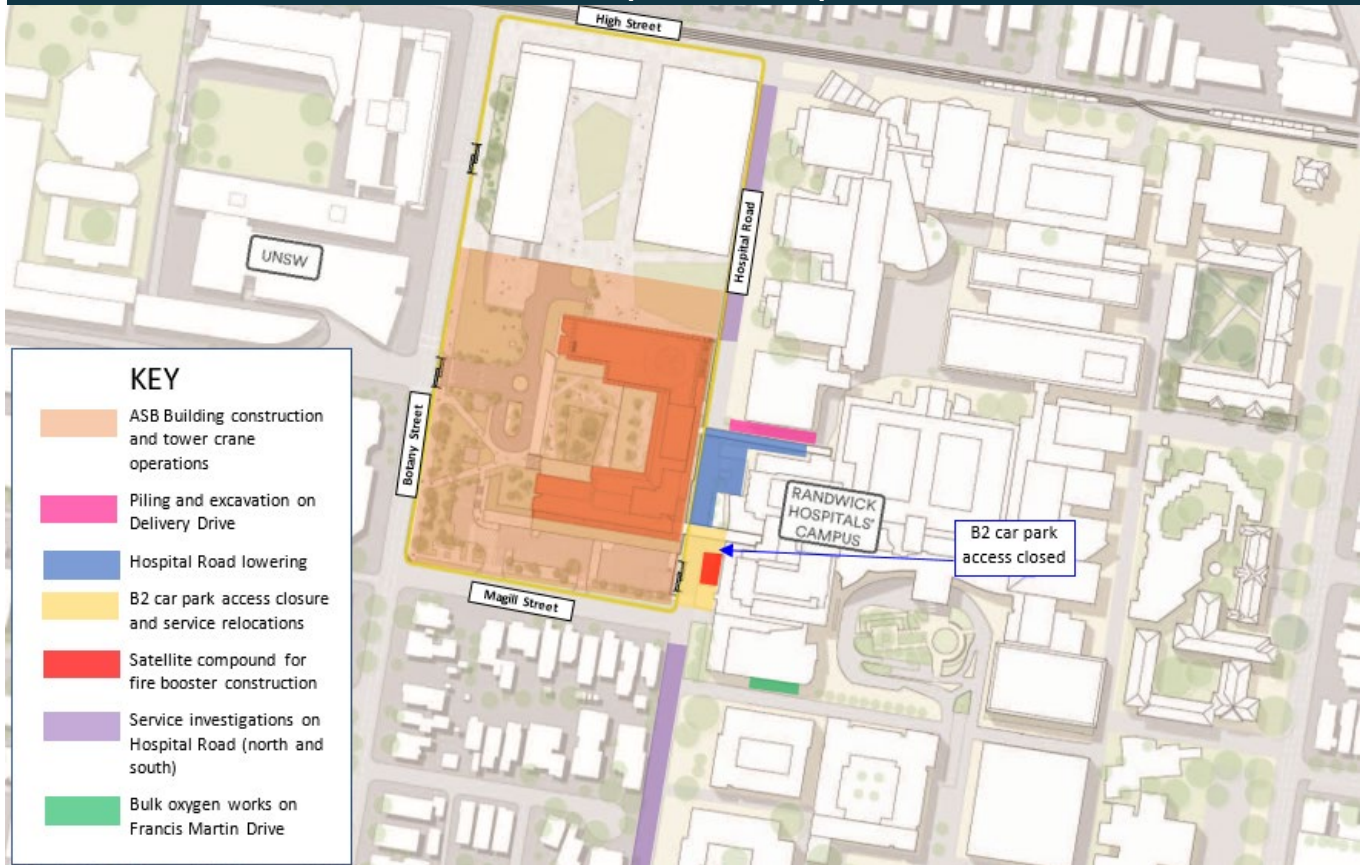
