

Construction activities continue on-site for the Prince of Wales Hospital Integrated Acute Services Building (IASB); the first stage of the Randwick Campus Redevelopment and the catalyst project for expanding the world-class health, research and education facilities at the Randwick precinct.

Key construction activities continuing during December include:

- IASB concrete pouring, structural works and façade installation
- Bulk excavation and road pavement works in both the northern and southern portion of Hospital Road
- Services investigations, relocations and upgrades
- Installation of Gate 7 on Magill Street
- Bulk oxygen storage facility installation on Francis Martin Drive with single lane closures
- Works internal to the Hospital Campus car park
- High Street footpath restoration work
- Reopening of B2 car park entry from Monday 14 December.

Stage 3 of Hospital Road lowering will commence in early December with the relocation of the construction compound north along Hospital Road towards High Street. Activities will include piling, excavation, services upgrades and road restoration.

Access to Delivery Drive via Hospital Road will switch from High Street to Barker Street, whilst access to Hospital car parks and Francis Martin Drive will be maintained from Barker Street.

During these works, there will be temporary closures of Delivery Drive, restricting external access to loading docks. Alternative arrangements will be in place to ensure continuity of essential deliveries and collections, and will be communicated prior to each closure.

An existing median strip on Barker St, at the Hospital Road intersection, will be modified to enable freight and service vehicles to turn right from Barker Street into Hospital Road. These works will occur out of hours and be notified accordingly.

Holiday period site closure

The construction site will close from Thursday 24 December and reopen Monday 4 January 2021. During this time there will be no work undertaken on site. Additional 24/7 security patrols will be in place to maintain site security and safety.

Construction hours

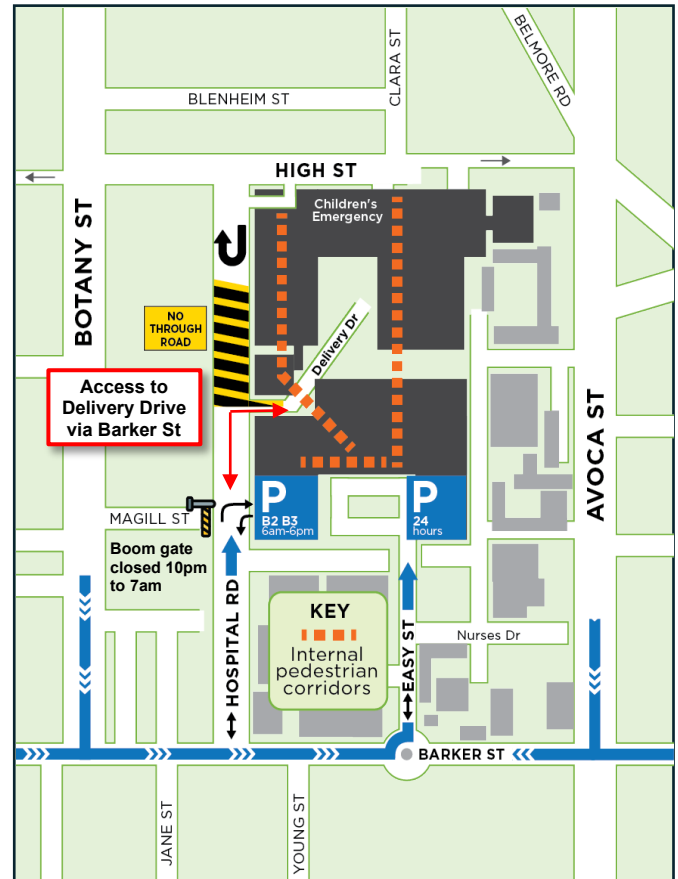
All activities are scheduled during approved site hours - **Monday to Friday 6am - 10pm and Saturday 7am - 5pm.**

Activities are dependent on weather and site conditions and are subject to change.

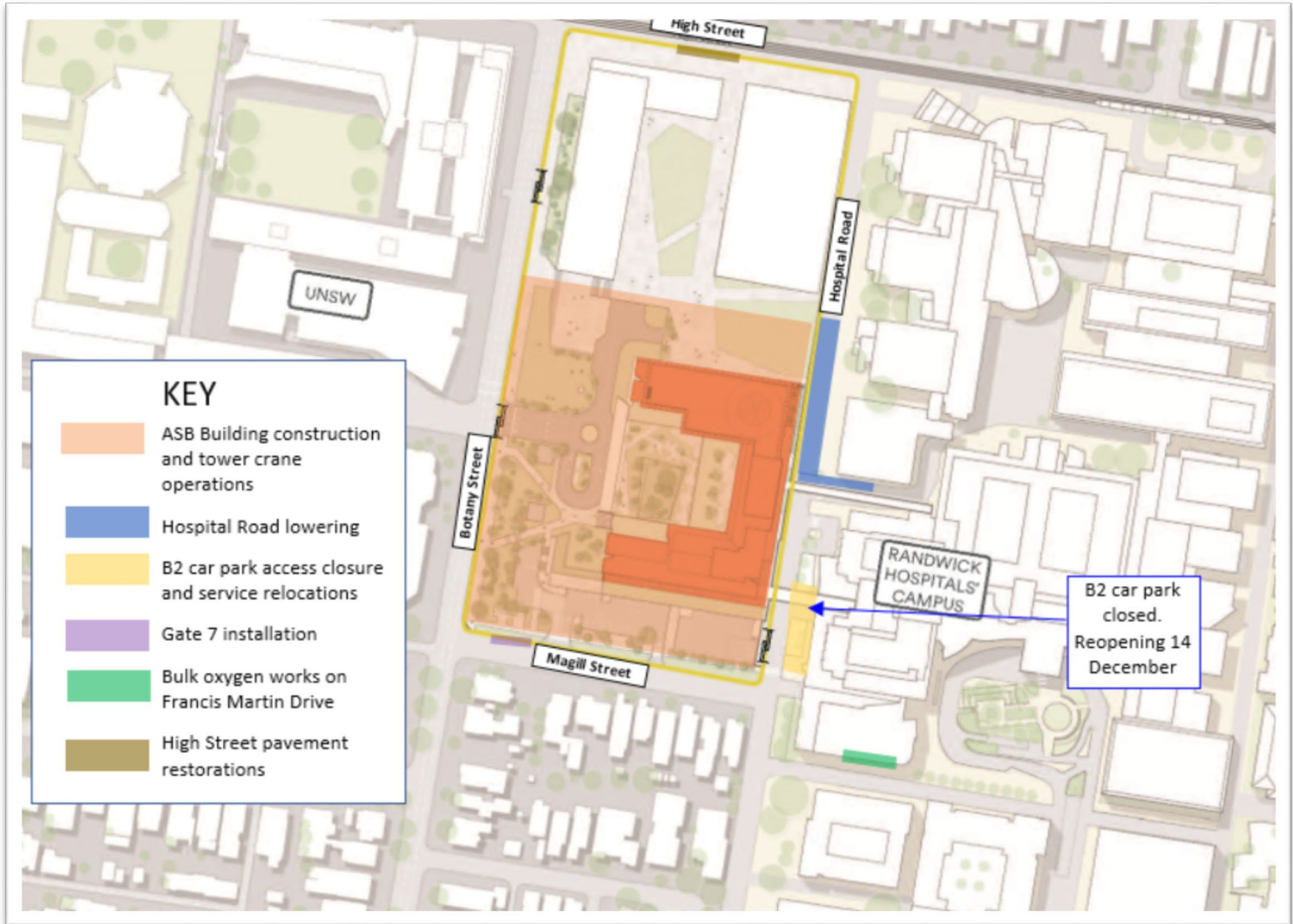

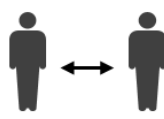
