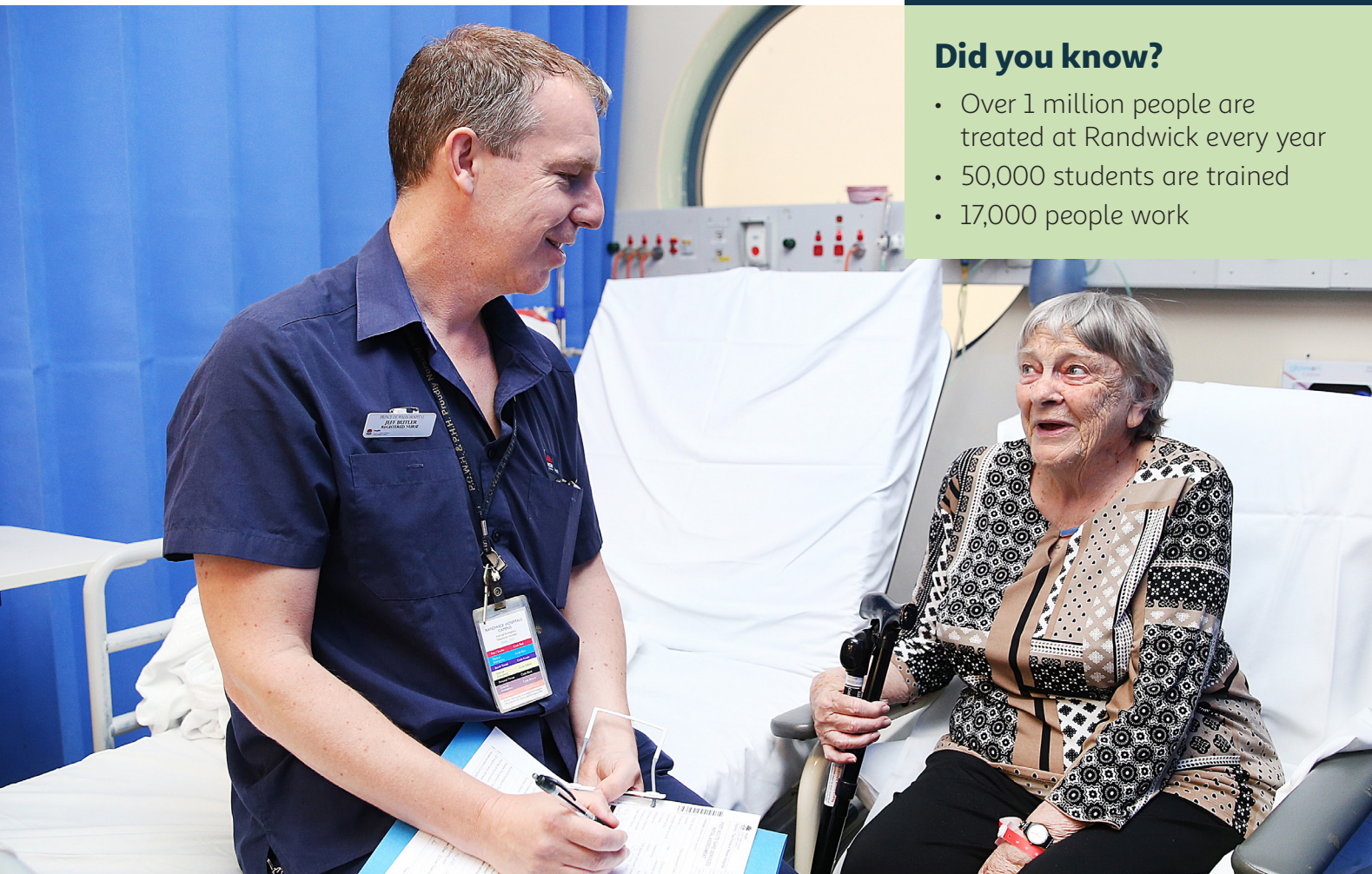
A new Prince of Wales Hospital Acute Services Building is being built in Stage 1 and will include:

- a new emergency department
- extra beds
- a new intensive care unit
- new operating theatres for the campus

The Randwick Campus Redevelopment will expand the Prince of Wales Hospital and ensure that the health, education, research and training services that are delivered at Randwick can continue to meet the needs of a growing population.

EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT EXPANSION

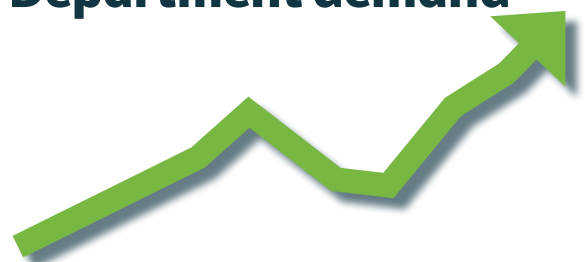
Over the next 10 years, the Prince of Wales Hospital faces a significant increase in demand. The Emergency Department is forecast to exceed its current operating capacity in 2018 and we need to expand urgently to continue to deliver patient-centred quality care.

As part of the Randwick Campus Redevelopment, the Prince of Wales Hospital Emergency Department will be refurbished and expanded to deliver eight new treatment spaces that will meet projected demand during the construction of the new Acute Services Building that will be built to the west of the existing campus.

The project is being delivered by Health Infrastructure in partnership with South Eastern Sydney Local Health District. The project will commence in late 2017 and will take approximately 12 months to complete.

The new Acute Services Building, incorporating a new adult emergency department, is expected to open in 2022.

Growing Emergency Department demand



Since 1995, presentations to the Adult Emergency Department have increased from 23,000 to over 58,500 per year.

Geotechnical and utility investigations inform project planning

During September and October, important geotechnical and utility investigations have been undertaken in the project area during the day.

Boreholes have been drilled to collect soil, rock and groundwater samples for analysis, and trenching to locate underground utilities has been undertaken on Magill Street, Hospital Road and Botany Street.

The team has made every effort to minimise the impacts of these activities. We thank you, the local community, for your patience during this important work.

The geology in the local area includes sand overlying Hawkesbury Sandstone. The geological formation is up to 290m thick and is a sedimentary rock formation created during the Middle Triassic Age roughly 240 million years ago.

Planning for the new Acute Services Building

Building a new hospital building takes many years.

The Prince of Wales Hospital has worked with the other hospitals and health services located on the Randwick Campus to undertake analysis and health planning. Research and consultation with clinicians and community members has considered:

- the critical health care needs of our community
- our changing demographics, and
- contemporary hospital design.

Expected to open in 2022 the new Acute Services Building will link into the heart of the four Hospitals located at Randwick and to future buildings that support health care delivery through integrated research, education and training.

Where are we up to?

Concept Design was completed in June 2017 which provided information on the outline of the Acute Services Building, its location and how it will share services and link in with the current hospitals.

Schematic Design, which looks at how rooms and services within individual wards and departments relate to each other and how services 'flow' between new and existing infrastructure is currently underway and is expected to be finalised in early 2018.

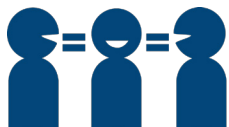
