Night works – Removal of gantry hoarding

As part of completion activities for the Prince of Wales Hospital Acute Services Building and UNSW Eastern Extension, the overhead protective hoardings on Hospital Road and Delivery Drive will soon be removed.

The overhead hoardings were required to ensure the safe construction of the patient link bridge connecting the new building to the existing campus.

Removal of the hoardings will be undertaken at night to ensure hospital loading dock continuity is maintained during business hours.

Night works are approved to occur up to four nights per week within the hours of **6pm and 4am** (no works on weekends). Any two consecutive nights of work will be followed by a respite night. Works are scheduled to commence mid-February and will take approximately four weeks to complete, weather permitting.

Night activity will include vehicle and plant movements, removal of structural steel beams and columns, lifting of gantry hoardings and unfastening of steel bolts to remove the hoarding from the supporting structure.

Intermittent construction noise may be heard throughout each shift, in particular relating to the unfastening of steel bolts.

Careful consideration has been placed on the planning of the hoarding removal to minimise noise and construction impacts, including scheduling and timing of the works.

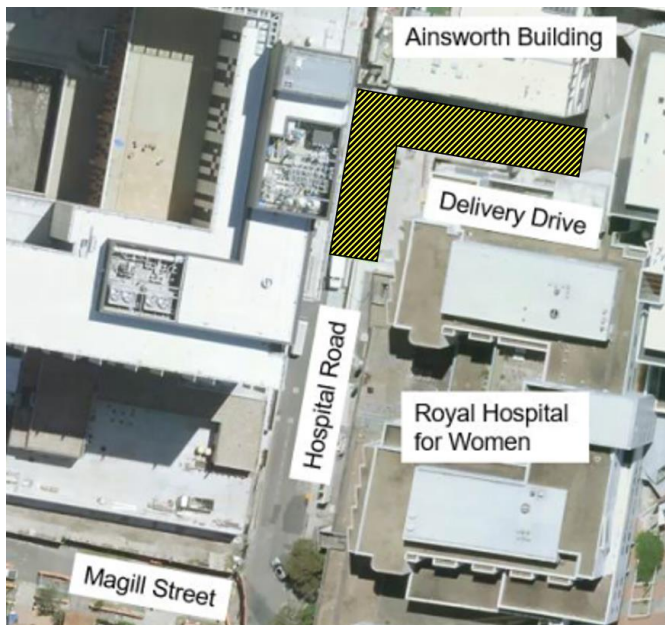
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Location of night works
