### **Construction Update**

Construction continues on both the Sydney Children's Hospital Stage 1 and Minderoo Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre (SCH1/MCCCC) and the UNSW Health Translation Hub (HTH) project sites, alongside ongoing internal works within the Prince of Wales Hospital Acute Services Building (ASB), and refurbishment activities in previously vacated hospital spaces.

### **Upcoming activities**

Footpath rectification works following recent water connection activities will require intermittent pedestrian diversions to the northern footpath on High Street, adjacent to the construction sites.

## Sydney Children's Hospital Stage 1 and Minderoo Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre

Progress continues on internal fit-out and service installations across all floors within the new building.

In early November, weekend works are planned to dismantle the second of two tower cranes, weather permitting. These activities will be undertaken within the construction site. During works, pedestrian travel on Botany Street will be diverted to the western footpath in the vicinity of the site.

Impacted stakeholders will be advised ahead of works commencing.

Civil and structural works on the future hospital entrance forecourt, located at the intersection of Hospital Road and High Street will also continue throughout November. These works may result in some intermittent construction noise and pedestrian diversions.

### **UNSW Health Translation Hub**

Suspended slab concrete pours for the main structure have now been completed. The removal of construction formwork and perimeter screening, along with the installation of façade panels, will continue throughout November.

Approved weekend site activities are planned during November to support tower crane modifications.

Detailed information will be provided to impacted stakeholders ahead of works commencing.

Landscaping works adjacent to the new link bridge support column on Botany Street will be undertaken in early November, temporarily closing the western footpath for a period of one week, with pedestrian diversions to the eastern footpath.


Site shed removal will also be undertaken throughout November. All works will take place within the construction site and during approved hours.

### Prince of Wales Hospital Acute Services Building and broader campus

Internal fit-out works to deliver new operating theatres and associated clinical spaces on Level 1 of the ASB will continue throughout November with minimal disruption to surrounding areas.

Construction sheds and site compounds will be set up in mid-November to support refurbishment work in several vacated areas across the hospital campus. Associated construction vehicle activity will be managed by traffic control and may temporarily affect vehicle movement on campus roads.

### **Managing construction activities**

We are committed to minimising the impact of our works. All construction activities are carried out with the health and safety of the local community and site workers as our top priority, and we endeavour to keep noise, dust and vibration to a minimum.

Where possible, activities are scheduled during approved site hours of **Monday to Friday**, **7am to 6pm and Saturday**, **8am to 5pm**. Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to weather or unforeseen circumstances.

Out of hours work will be communicated directly to affected stakeholders, and all activity dates and times remain subject to change. Inaudible concrete finishing and other works may extend beyond 6pm where necessary, as per conditions of Development Consent. Delivery of construction materials and equipment may also be undertaken out of hours where required by law due to vehicle size.

Please note that service upgrades unrelated to the project may also be undertaken by other agencies at any given time without notification.
