NOTICE OF CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITY

With construction of the new Sydney Children's Hospital Stage 1 and the Minderoo Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre (SCH1/MCCCC) well progressed, remaining site sheds and storage compounds adjacent to the Prince of Wales Hospital Acute Services Building (ASB) Botany Street entrance will be removed.

Site shed removal works will take place between 7am and 6pm from Thursday 12 to Thursday 19 December 2024.

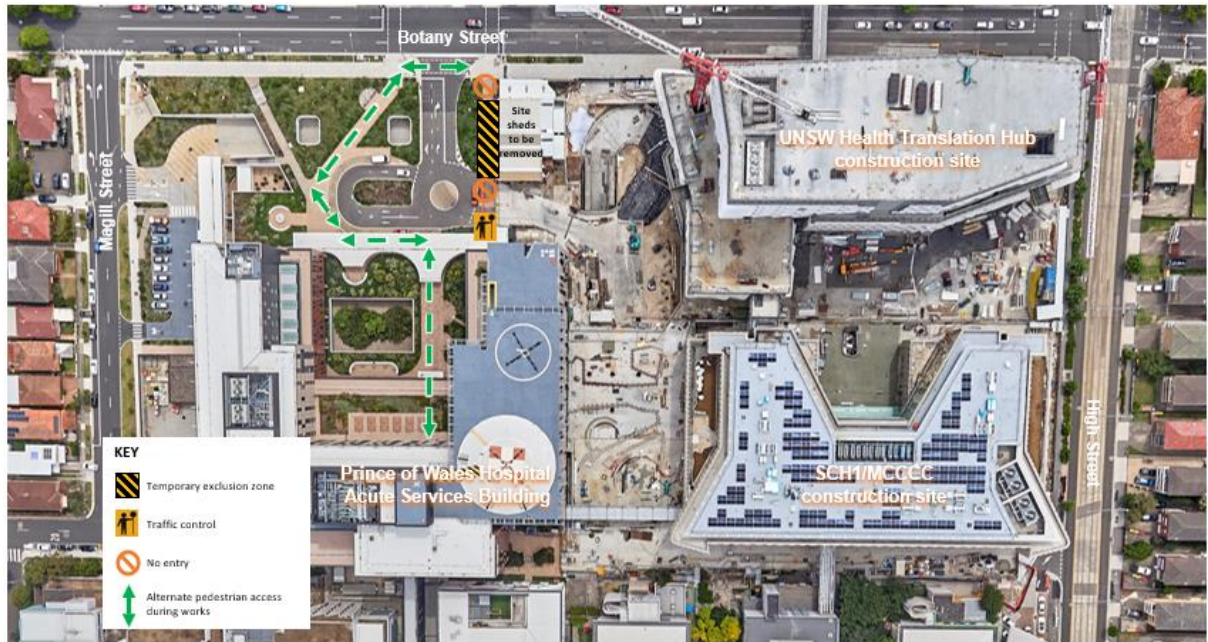
Construction vehicles and equipment will enter and exit the site via the construction gate adjacent to the Prince of Wales Hospital Acute Services Building (ASB) Botany Street entrance and carry out all activities from within construction site. Construction vehicle movements will be scheduled to minimise impact on local traffic and hospital access. All vehicle movements and equipment usage will be escorted and supervised by traffic controllers to ensure the safety of both vehicle and pedestrian traffic on campus.

A temporary exclusion zone within the ASB forecourt will be established to facilitate the safe lifting and removal of site sheds, as indicated in the location map below. A mobile crane will be utilised within the exclusion zone, along with elevated work platforms for removal activities.

During the works, pedestrian access at the Prince of Wales Hospital Botany Street entrance will be temporarily impacted, with pedestrians directed to the southern footpath within the ASB forecourt, under traffic control. Vehicle access to the ASB drop-off zone will be maintained at all times.

These activities may generate minor noise from vehicle movements and loading operations.
