UNSW Sydney has partnered with the Plenary Group-led Consortium to deliver the UNSW HTH. The long-term partnership involves Plenary Health, ISPT, UniSuper and HESTA funding, developing and operating the 35,600-square-metre facility, with UNSW occupying 65 percent of the available space. The remaining space will be open to industry, providing an opportunity for like-minded partners to co-locate with the University and within the hospital precinct.

- World-class infrastructure and systems designed to support a more efficient and connected health system
- Acceleration of testing of new ways to prevent and treat diseases
- The design and evaluation of models of care through clinical research and clinical trials
- The co-location of Minderoo Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre within the UNSW HTH and the new Sydney Children's Hospital at Randwick, enabling accelerated care and treatment outcomes.

- Pedestrian prioritised pathways to easily connect the new and existing buildings of the Precinct and the broader UNSW Kensington Campus
- Targeting to be Sydney's first 6 Star Green Star Building.
