

PRINCE OF WALES HOSPITAL ACUTE SERVICES BUILDING AND REFURBISHMENT WORKS

Randwick Campus Redevelopment

ONGOING WORKS FACT SHEET - 2024

The NSW Government delivered the Prince of Wales Hospital (PoWH) Acute Services Building (ASB) in the first stage of the Randwick Campus Redevelopment.

The ASB was the catalyst project for master-planned infrastructure transformation of the Randwick Health Campus and for expanding the world-class health, research and education facilities within the broader Randwick Health and Innovation Precinct.



Prince of Wales Hospital ongoing works - Acute Services Building and broader campus

Since becoming operational in early 2023, a range of PoWH services have relocated to the new building, and as part of the ASB project, a number of vacated spaces within the existing hospital buildings are being refurbished to accommodate the relocation of key hospital and campus services.

A further funding commitment from the NSW Government is also supporting the delivery of eight operating theatres and associated recovery spaces, an Intensive Care Unit pod and two additional wards within the ASB.

Planning and staged delivery of these additional works is currently underway, with related construction activity set to continue throughout 2024 and into 2025.

This ongoing activity will take place alongside the continued construction of the adjacent Sydney Children's Hospital Stage 1 and Minderoo Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre (SCH1/MCCCC) building and UNSW Health Translation Hub (UNSW HTH) building.

Key works

Operating theatres

(Level 1 of ASB)

An Acute Services Operating Suite (ASOS) is being created on Level 1 of the ASB and will house 12 operating theatres, including emergency theatres and a hybrid theatre. The hybrid theatre will boast built-in imaging capabilities, designed to perform minimally invasive surgery and enabled for conversion to an open procedure if required.

The PoWH Change and Commissioning Team has been working with operating theatre staff on the design, model of care and identification of state-of-the-art equipment for the new facilities, which are set to become operational from late 2025.

With fit-out works being undertaken within an operational hospital environment, the project team will implement a range of measures to minimise the impact of construction activity on patients, staff and visitors.

Central Equipment Store

(in former CSSD - Level 3 Campus Centre)

Following design and fit-out, the Central Equipment Store will move from its temporary location on Level 2 of the ASB into the former Central Sterilizing Services Department space on Level 3 of the Campus Centre building.

The new space will provide centralised management, tracking, cleaning, storage and maintenance of PoWH medical and patient equipment.

Haemodialysis / Nephrology Outpatient Unit (in former Emergency Department – L0 Dickinson Building)

A major update to the former Emergency Department on Level 0 of the Dickinson Building will provide a space for PoWH to bring together its haemodialysis services and renal outpatient clinics in a new, central location.

This integrated unit will allow comprehensive care for patients at all stages of their treatment journey and be home to the Eora Dialysis Centre (currently based at War Memorial Hospital in Waverley), Haemodialysis, Home Training Unit and renal outpatient clinics.

The centralised space will transform kidney care at PoWH, helping to provide the very best healthcare to patients.

Security Services and PoWH staff on-call rooms (in former PECC – LO Dickinson building)

The former Psychiatric Emergency Care Centre (PECC) on Level 0 of the Dickinson Building, adjacent to the former Emergency Department, will be refurbished for the Randwick Campus Security Services team, along with the provision of on-call accommodation for PoWH staff.


The new space will provide a fit-for-purpose base for Security Services, with upgraded technology and a dedicated control room, while the PoWH on-call rooms will provide onsite accommodation for staff rostered on-call.

All refurbishment works are scheduled to commence in October 2024, with spaces expected to become operational in stages during the second half of 2025.

Completed works

Fit-out works within Level 6 of the ASB have been completed to support the future relocation of PoWH General Surgery and Specialist Surgery inpatient units. The PoWH Change and Commissioning Team has been working with staff on the model of care and commissioning plan in readiness for the units to relocate in late 2024.

The Intensive Care Unit expansion fit-out has also been completed to deliver an additional pod, supporting the hospital's pandemic plan.



Please note that ongoing construction activity within the ASB and refurbishment spaces may result in intermittent noise and/or access impacts.

Any significantly impactful works will be notified to key stakeholders prior to activities being undertaken.
