

### Construction Update

**Alongside ongoing internal works within the Prince of Wales Hospital Acute Services Building (ASB) and refurbishment activities in previously vacated hospital spaces, main works construction continues on the sites of the Sydney Children’s Hospital 1 and Minderoo Children’s Comprehensive Cancer Centre (SCH1/MCCCC) project and adjacent UNSW Health Translation Hub (HTH).**

#### Upcoming activities

Ongoing preparatory works to connect the new buildings to the existing water supply on High Street will temporarily impact the southern footpath adjacent to the construction sites, with pedestrian diversions in place where required. Overnight works to enable the connection will be undertaken by Sydney Water and communicated separately to impacted residents and stakeholders.

#### Sydney Children’s Hospital Stage 1 and Minderoo Children’s Comprehensive Cancer Centre

With the main structure now watertight, internal fit-out and services installation is progressing across all floors.

Civil and structural works on the future hospital entrance forecourt at the intersection of Hospital Road and High Street are continuing. These works may result in some intermittent construction noise.

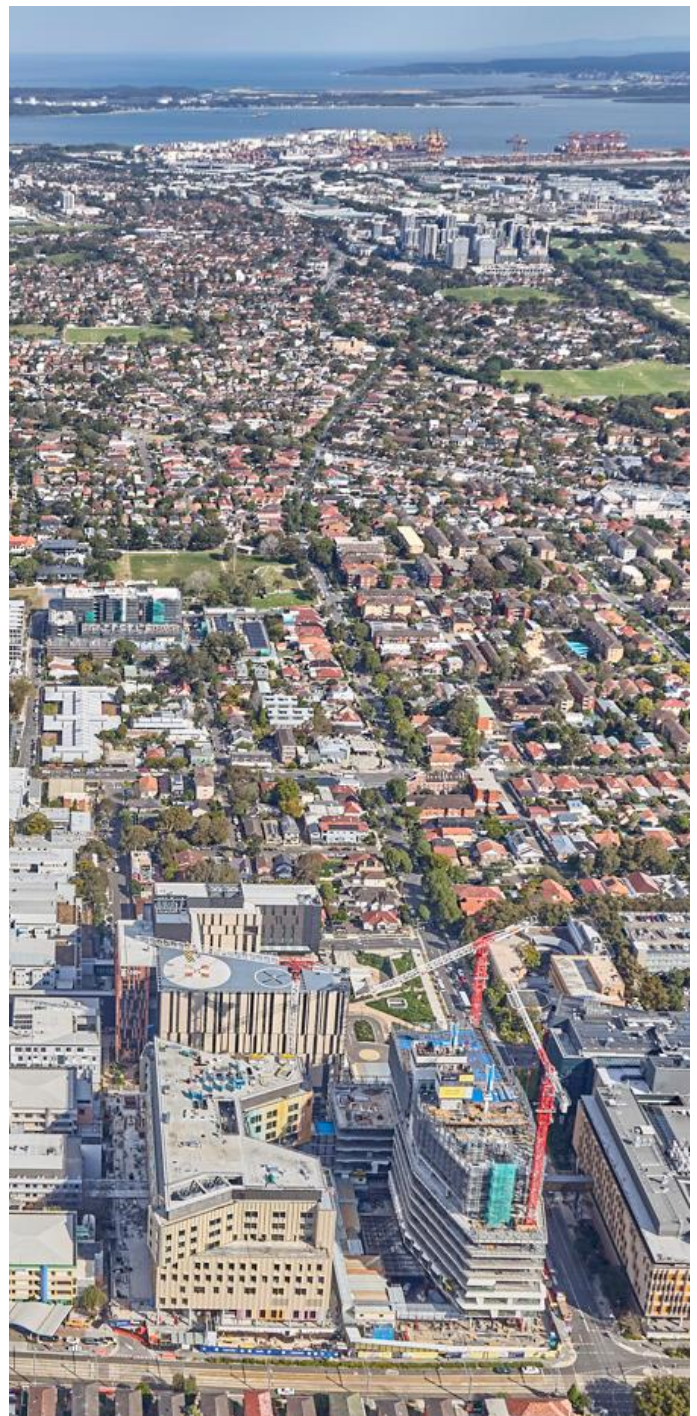
Weekend works are planned for late October/early November to dismantle the second of two tower cranes, weather permitting. All activities will be undertaken from within the construction site and impacted stakeholders will be advised ahead of works commencing.

Alternate construction vehicle access to the SCH1/MCCCC site has now commenced via Hospital Road, off Barker Street.

#### UNSW Health Translation Hub

Construction is progressing, with suspended slab pouring activities now underway on the building’s top level, alongside internal wall construction, services installation and façade panel installation.

Preliminary works to connect the new building to the electricity supply will conclude in October, with overnight activity required to enable the final connection. Detailed information will be provided to



affected stakeholders prior to any planned power supply impacts.

Landscaping works adjacent to the new link bridge support column on Botany Street will be undertaken in October, temporarily closing the western footpath for a period of one week, with pedestrian diversions to the eastern footpath.

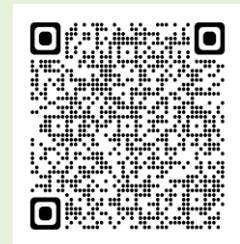
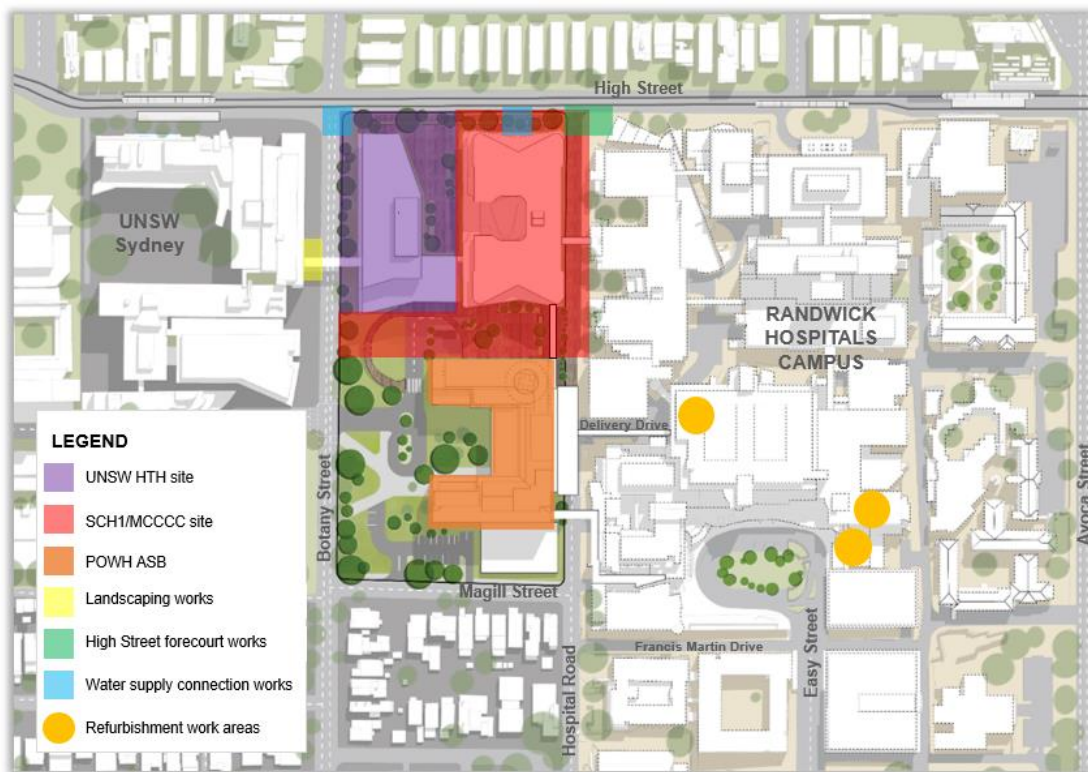
### Prince of Wales Hospital Acute Services Building and broader campus

Internal fit-out works to deliver new operating theatres on Level 1 of the ASB will continue throughout October with minimal impact to adjoining areas.

Late October will see the delivery and set-up of construction sheds and site compounds to support refurbishment works within a number of vacated spaces across the broader hospital campus. Heavy vehicle activity during the set-up will be managed by traffic control and may temporarily impact vehicle movements on campus roads. Detailed information will be provided to affected stakeholders prior to commencement of these activities.

The Prince of Wales Hospital's Specialty Surgery and General Surgery wards will relocate from the Dickinson Building to Level 6 of the ASB in late October, with the new spaces offering additional single-patient rooms with ensuites.

### Managing construction activities

We are committed to minimising the impact of our works. All construction activities are carried out with the health and safety of the local community and site workers as our top priority, and we endeavour to keep noise, dust and vibration to a minimum.

Where possible, activities are scheduled during approved site hours of **Monday to Friday, 7am to 6pm and Saturday, 8am to 5pm**. Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to weather or unforeseen circumstances.

Out of hours work will be communicated directly to affected stakeholders, and all activity dates and times remain subject to change. Inaudible concrete finishing and other works may extend beyond 6pm where necessary, as per conditions of Development Consent. Delivery of construction materials and equipment may also be undertaken out of hours where required by law due to vehicle size.
