



## Construction Update

Main works construction continues to progress on the site of the Sydney Children's Hospital Stage 1 and Minderoo Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre (SCH1/MCCCC) project and adjacent UNSW Health Translation Hub (HTH), alongside internal fit-out works within the Prince of Wales Hospital (PoWH) Acute Services Building (ASB).

### Upcoming activities

#### Sydney Children's Hospital Stage 1 and Minderoo Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre

Façade and window panel installations are nearing completion, with internal fit-out and services installation underway across all levels.

Early work on the future hospital entrance forecourt at the intersection of Hospital Road and High Street will continue throughout August, requiring intermittent traffic control measures to manage vehicle movements within the existing Sydney Children's Hospital, Randwick drop-off area. Some intermittent construction noise may result from these works.

Approved intermittent out of hours equipment deliveries are scheduled to take place during August.

#### Prince of Wales Hospital Acute Services Building and broader campus

A range of temporary construction work areas will be implemented in the ASB Botany Street foyer (B1) and atrium level (L0) during August to enable building drainage modifications. Diversions around construction areas will be in place for the duration of works, with noise impacts mitigated as much as possible.

Internal fit-out works to deliver operating theatres within Level 1 of the building will continue in August.

Construction hoarding installation to support future refurbishment works in a number of vacated spaces within the broader hospital campus will commence in August, with some construction noise possible as a result of these activities.

### UNSW Health Translation Hub

Concrete slab pours have advanced to Level 10, alongside removal of formwork on lower levels and installation of exterior façade panels.

Services installation and wall construction, including partition framing and lining, continues up to Level 5, along with lift installation works.

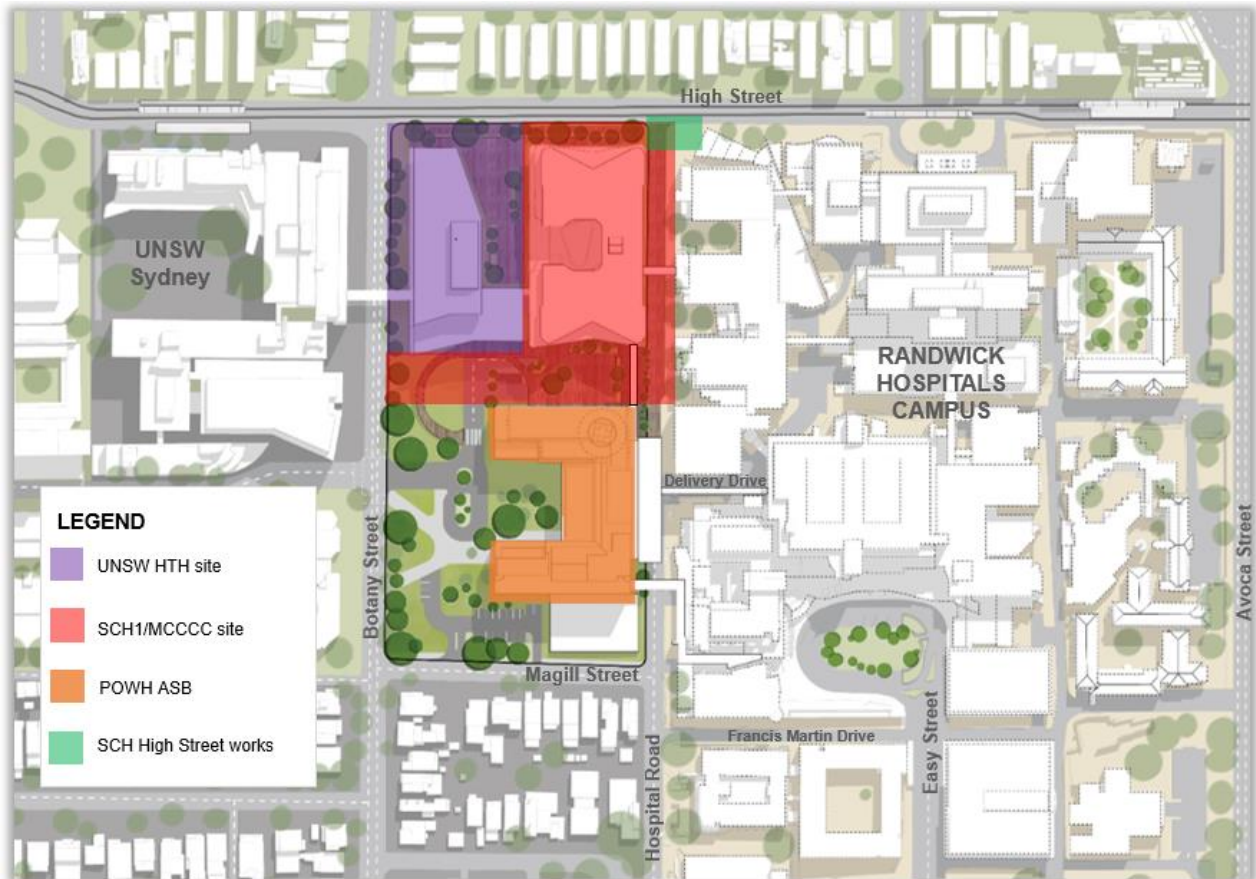
During August, work to connect the new building to the water supply will temporarily affect pedestrian access

on the southern footpath of High Street, with diversions implemented as required.

Landscaping works in the vicinity of the new link bridge support column on Botany Street will require temporary closure of the western footpath, with pedestrian diversions in place.

Approved intermittent out of hours activities for delivery of construction materials and equipment will also continue during August.

#### Managing construction activities

We are committed to minimising the impact of our works. All construction activities are carried out with the health and safety of the local community and site workers as our top priority, and we endeavour to keep noise, dust and vibration to a minimum.

Where possible, activities are scheduled during approved site hours of **Monday to Friday, 7am to 6pm and Saturday, 8am to 5pm**. Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to weather or unforeseen circumstances.

Out of hours work will be communicated directly to affected stakeholders, and all activity dates and times remain subject to change. Inaudible concrete finishing and other works may extend beyond 6pm where necessary, as per conditions of Development Consent.
