Works on the Randwick Campus Redevelopment site continue into 2023. Visit the project website for the latest information on site activities and to learn more about each of the buildings being constructed.

Upcoming activities

Prince of Wales Hospital Acute Services Building

Prince of Wales Hospital (POWH) services and departments have been moving into the new Acute Services Building (ASB) throughout March, opening the facility to patients and the community.

The ASB main entrance and drop-off zone is now operational and accessed via the new signalised intersection on Botany Street.

Forecourt landscaping works will continue during April, with construction activity within the new building continuing throughout the year to fit out additional hospital spaces and the UNSW Eastern Extension.

The POWH Adult Emergency Department (ED) will soon relocate to the new building (date to be confirmed), with a dedicated public drop-off/pick-up area and limited short stay parking accessed off Magill Street, via Botany Street, from this time.

The existing ED, located adjacent to the Barker Street entrance to POWH, will close on the day of the move.

Magill Street boom gate

Works to install a boom gate at the intersection of Magill Street and Hospital Road are now complete.

The boom gate will become operational in line with the ED move and will be open between 7am and 10pm daily to enable efficient access to the campus car park and Adult ED.

The boom gate will be closed after hours to restrict through traffic and support improved amenity for nearby residents.

Hospital Road and Delivery Drive night works As part of completion works for the ASB and UNSW

Eastern Extension, overhead protective hoardings on Hospital Road and Delivery Drive are being removed.

Final stages of the removal works will be completed over two weeks during April, weather permitting. These works will be undertaken on weeknights between 6pm and 4am to ensure hospital loading dock continuity during business hours, and may generate intermittent construction noise.

Hospital Road line marking works will also be completed over two nights during early April.

Sydney Children's Hospital Stage 1 and Minderoo Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre (SCH1/MCCCC)

Bulk excavation works continue on the site of the future children's hospital and cancer centre building, with excavation of lower levels nearing completion.

Weekend site activity is planned during April to install the first of two tower cranes that will support ongoing construction.

Works are scheduled for between 7am and 6pm on Saturday 1 and Sunday 2 April to install the first crane, weather permitting. A second crane will be installed during May.

Approved early hours activity during April is also planned to enable the delivery of construction materials. These works may result in minor to moderate noise impacts from vehicles entering and exiting the site, and the unloading of equipment.

High Street works

Intermittent works will be undertaken at the corner of High Street and Hospital Road during 2023 alongside construction of the SCH1/MCCCC building.


Works are planned during April to enable the connection of a newly installed substation. Detailed information will be provided to affected stakeholders ahead of activities commencing.

Botany Street footpath closure

In early April for approximately two weeks, landscaping and works to reinstate a section of kerb and guttering adjacent to the current construction site will see the temporary closure of the eastern footpath on Botany Street, between High Street and the new signalised intersection in front of the ASB.

Pedestrian diversions to the western footpath will be in place for the duration of works.

All activity dates are subject to change.

Managing construction activities

We are committed to minimising the impact of our works.

All construction activities are carried out with the health and safety of the local community and site workers as our top priority. We endeavour to keep noise, dust and vibration to a minimum.

Where possible, activities are scheduled during approved site hours of **Monday to Friday, 7am to 6pm and Saturday, 8am to 5pm.**
