

## Construction Update

Works on the Randwick Campus Redevelopment continue to progress. The redevelopment incorporates the newly opened Prince of Wales Hospital (POWH) Acute Services Building (ASB), along with the future Sydney Children's Hospital Stage 1 and Minderoo Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre (SCH1/MCCCC) building, and UNSW's Health Translation Hub (HTH).

### Upcoming activities

#### Prince of Wales Hospital Acute Services Building

Following more than three years of construction, services and departments successfully moved into the newly opened Prince of Wales Hospital (POWH) Acute Services Building (ASB) during March.

The POWH Adult Emergency Department (ED) will relocate to level B2 of the ASB at 7.30am on Wednesday 3 May. The dedicated ED public drop-off/pick-up area accessible off Magill Street, via Botany Street, will become operational from this time.

The ED will also be accessible to pedestrians from within the existing hospitals campus via a dedicated public link bridge to the new building, or via the ASB main entrance on Botany Street.

The existing ED, located adjacent to the Barker Street entrance to POWH, will close from 7.30am on the day of the move, with all patients redirected to the new location from this time. Staff will be available to assist patients in navigating to the new location.

Ongoing construction activity to fit out additional hospital spaces within the new ASB and the adjoining UNSW Eastern Extension will continue throughout the year.

#### Magill Street boom gate

The new boom gate at the intersection of Magill Street and Hospital Road will become operational in line with the ED move on Wednesday 3 May and will be open between 7am and 10pm daily to enable efficient access to the campus car park and new Adult ED.

The boom gate will be closed after hours to restrict through traffic and support improved amenity for nearby residents.

Emergency vehicle access will be maintained.



## Sydney Children's Hospital Stage 1 and Minderoo Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre (SCH1/MCCCC)

Bulk excavation works on site are expected to be completed by late-June, weather permitting.

Weekend site activity is planned for early to mid-May to install a second tower crane to support ongoing construction. Detailed information will be provided to affected stakeholders ahead of activities commencing. The tower cranes will allow materials to be efficiently and safely lifted within the construction site.

From late May, the western portion of the current SCH1/MCCCC site will transform into the construction site for the future UNSW Health Translation Hub. Initial works will include site establishment and delivery of site sheds for UNSW's build contractor.

### Hospital Road and Delivery Drive night works

As part of completion works for the ASB and UNSW Eastern Extension, overhead protective hoardings on Hospital Road and Delivery Drive are being removed.

Final stages of the removal works will be completed over coming months, weather permitting, and undertaken on weeknights to ensure hospital loading dock continuity during business hours. These works may generate intermittent construction noise.

### Managing construction activities

We are committed to minimising the impact of our works.

All construction activities are carried out with the health and safety of the local community and site workers as our top priority.

We endeavour to keep noise, dust and vibration to a minimum.

Where possible, activities are scheduled during approved site hours of **Monday to Friday, 7am to 6pm and Saturday, 8am to 5pm.**

Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to weather or unforeseen circumstances such as workforce availability.

Out of hours work will continue to be communicated directly to affected stakeholders.

All activity dates and times are subject to change.
