## Randwick Campus Redevelopment

February 2025



## Construction Update

Following a short festive season break, construction is again in full swing on the Randwick Campus Redevelopment site, with main works progressing on both the Sydney Children's Hospital Stage 1 and Minderoo Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre (SCH1/MCCCC) and the UNSW Health Translation Hub (HTH) project sites. Internal works continue within the Prince of Wales Hospital Acute Services Building (ASB), alongside the commencement of refurbishment works in previously vacated spaces across the hospital campus.

### Upcoming activities

#### **Sydney Children's Hospital Stage 1 and Minderoo Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre**

Internal fit-out and service installations are progressing across all levels of the new 12-storey children's hospital and research centre building.

Structural works on the future building entrance forecourt on High Street will continue throughout February. Temporary pedestrian and/or vehicle diversions may be required during these works. Noise impacts will be mitigated as much as possible.

#### **Prince of Wales Hospital Acute Services Building and broader campus**

Internal fit-out works to complete the new operating theatres on Level 1 of the ASB will continue throughout February. Associated works within the mezzanine level of the main entrance foyer will see a temporary construction zone in place until late March.

Refurbishment works have commenced in a number of vacated areas across the hospital campus, with measures in place to minimise any construction impacts on nearby departments and public spaces.



## UNSW Health Translation Hub

Main works continues to progress, with façade panel installation on the main tower now complete and internal fit-out and services installation ongoing across all levels.

Forecourt landscaping works will commence in February and will include the delivery of large landscaping items, such as mature trees, which will be craned into place. During these works, intermittent pedestrian diversions will be in place on High Street in the vicinity of the site.

Works to complete connection of the new pedestrian link bridge between UNSW's Kensington Campus and the Randwick Hospitals Campus are underway and will continue throughout February. Temporary hoarding and exclusion zones are in place on the western footpath of Botany Street to support the removal of existing Wallace Wurth Building façade panels and installation of new façade.

Fit-out works within the new pedestrian link bridge will also continue throughout February.

Out of hours activities are planned across two weekends in February to support the dismantle of the project's tower cranes, weather permitting. Detailed information will be provided to affected stakeholders prior to the commencement of these works.

## Managing construction activities

We are committed to minimising the impact of our works. All construction activities are carried out with the health and safety of the local community and site workers as our top priority, and we endeavour to keep noise, dust and vibration to a minimum.

Where possible, activities are scheduled during approved site hours of **Monday to Friday, 7am to 6pm and Saturday, 8am to 5pm**. Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to weather or unforeseen circumstances.

Out of hours work will be communicated directly to affected stakeholders, and all activity dates and times remain subject to change. Inaudible concrete finishing and other works may extend beyond 6pm where necessary, in line with planning conditions.

Delivery of construction materials and equipment may also be undertaken out of hours where required by law due to vehicle size.

*Please note that service upgrades unrelated to the project may also be undertaken by other agencies at any time without notification.*
