Upcoming activities

Prince of Wales Hospital Acute Services Building

Following an extensive program of commissioning activities, Prince of Wales Hospital services have commenced moving into the new Acute Services Building (ASB), with the first inpatient ward moves scheduled from early March.

The public link bridge connecting the existing hospital campus to the ASB will open on Tuesday 7 March, accessed from inside the Barker Street hospital entrance (Level 0).

The new main entrance and drop-off zone for the ASB will open on Tuesday 14 March, accessed from the new signalised intersection on Botany Street.

External landscaping, including completion of the building's forecourt area, will continue during March.

Construction activity within the new building will continue throughout 2023 to fit out additional hospital spaces and the UNSW Eastern Extension.



Hospital Road night works

As part of completion works for the ASB and UNSW Eastern Extension, overhead protective hoardings on Hospital Road are being removed.

Removal works are currently underway and undertaken at night between 6pm and 4am weekdays to ensure hospital loading dock continuity during business hours.

Intermittent construction noise may be heard throughout each shift, primarily as a result of the unfastening of steel bolts. Works are expected to be completed by mid-March, weather permitting.

Botany Street signalised intersection

Works to deliver a new four-way signalised intersection on Botany Street are now complete.

Initial three-way signal phasing to support improved access to UNSW Kensington Campus has been in place since mid-February, with permanent four-way phasing to enable access to the new ASB main entrance and drop-off zone scheduled to be implemented from Monday 13 March.

The new intersection is supported by changes to parking and No Stopping zones on Botany Street.

Sydney Children's Hospital Stage 1 and Minderoo Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre

Structural piling works have now been completed on the site of the new children's hospital, with remediation and bulk excavation works continuing.

New contractor site accommodation has been installed along the High Street frontage, with construction workers now entering the site via a dedicated High Street pedestrian entrance.

The project will welcome two tower cranes to site during autumn, with weekend installation works planned. Detailed information regarding out of hours activity will be provided to nearby stakeholders ahead of works commencing.

Alongside works on site, the project team continues to consult with hospital staff and stakeholders to finalise the interior design, architecture and service design elements of the new building.

High Street night works

Intermittent night works on the corner of High Street and Hospital Road will be undertaken throughout 2023 to support construction of the new children's hospital building.

Upcoming works are planned to enable the installation of a new kiosk substation and associated cabling from mid-March. Works will be scheduled between 8pm and 5am and will include excavation and installation of infrastructure, requiring associated equipment and machinery. Detailed information will be provided to nearby stakeholders ahead of works.

Magill Street boom gate installation

Works to install a boom gate at the intersection of Magill Street and Hospital Road are currently underway.

Once operational, in line with the staged opening of the ASB, the boom gate will be open between 7am and 10pm to enable efficient access to the campus car park and Adult Emergency Department.

The boom gate will be closed after hours to restrict through traffic and support improved amenity for residents.

Managing construction activities

We are committed to minimising the impact of our works.

All construction activities are carried out with the health and safety of the local community and site workers as our top priority. We endeavour to keep noise, dust and vibration to a minimum.

Where possible, activities are scheduled during approved site hours of **Monday to Friday, 7am to 6pm and Saturday, 8am to 5pm.**

Work may be rescheduled due to weather or unforeseen circumstances such as workforce availability.

Out of hours work will continue to be communicated directly to affected stakeholders.
